





Covid-19 related pupil absence

A reference guide for parents and school / setting staff (as of 1st of April 2021)

What to do if	Action Needed	Return to school when
my child has developed one or more Covid-19 symptoms: • a new continuous cough • a high temperature • a loss of, or change in, normal sense of taste or smell	 → Do not come to school or setting → Contact school or setting to inform us → Child to get a PCR test via nhs.uk online or by calling 119 (please note an LFD test should NOT be used for people with symptoms) 	Either the PCR test comes back negative Or a period of 10 days has passed since the symptoms started, the child feels well and does not have a temperature.
	 → Members of the household should self-isolate for 10 days. See Stay at Home guidance → Inform the school or setting immediately about any test results → If after 10 days, your child still has a temperature they should continue to self-isolate and seek medical advice 	
my child tests positive for Covid -19 using a PCR test	 → Do not come to school or setting → Contact school or setting to inform us → Agree the earliest date for the possible return (minimum 10 days) → Members of the household should self-isolate for 10 days. See Stay at Home guidance 	10 days have passed since symptoms began, even if they still have a cough or loss of taste/smell (these symptoms can last for several weeks) AND the child feels well
my child tests negative with a PCR test	 → Contact school or setting to inform us → Discuss when your child can come back (same day/next day) → Subject to the following: everyone they live with who has symptoms, tests negative everyone in their support bubble who has symptoms, tests negative they are not a contact of a confirmed case they are well – if they feel unwell, stay at home until feeling better 	the test comes back negative
I am unable to get a test for someone in the household who has symptoms.	 → If you are unable to get a test, your child and anyone they live with must continue to self-isolate for 10 days. Anyone in your support bubble must also stay at home. → Speak to your school as they might be able to help you 	Either the child has completed 10 days of isolation. Orthe PCR test is negative

my child tests positive for Covid -19 using a LFD testing kit	→ Follow instructions from school, stay at home and	Either

	→ Contact school to inform us of the test result as soon as possible

my child is ill with symptoms not linked to Covid-19	→ Contact school or setting to inform us	after 48 hours following
	→ Ring on each day of illness	the last bout of sickness or diarrhea (as per the attendance policy).
someone in my household has Covid- 19 symptoms	→ Do not come to school or setting	the test comes back negative
	→ Contact school or setting to inform us	
	→ Members of the household should self-isolate for 10 days. See Stay at Home guidance	
	→ Household member to get a test via nhs.uk online or by calling 119	
	→ Inform the school or setting immediately about the test results	
someone in my	→ Your child will need to self-isolate for 10 days.	my child has completed 10 days of self-isolation.
household tests positive for Covid-19	→ Support your child at home with any remote education provided by your school.	
	→ Other members of the household should self-isolate for 10 days. See Stay at Home guidance	
NHS test and trace	→ Child must not come to school	my child has completed 10 days of self-isolation.
has identified my child as a close contact of a	→ Support your child at home with any remote education provided by your school.	
confirmed positive case	→ Your child will need to self-isolate for 10 days.	
	→ Other siblings may continue to attend school provided they have not been identified as contacts and they don't have any COVID symptoms	
NHS test and trace has identified a household member (not my child) as a close contact of a confirmed positive case	→ The household member must self-isolate for 10 days	child(ren) can continue to attend school provided they don't have symptoms and/or have tested positive.
	→ Child can continue to attend school until or unless the child or anyone else in the household develops COVID symptoms and/or tests positive.	
my child has been	→ You will receive a letter of notification from school	my child has completed 10 days of self-isolation.
identified as a close contact of a confirmed positive case within school	→ Child must not come to school	
	→ Support your child at home with any remote education provided by your school.	
	→ Your child will need to self-isolate for 10 days.	
	→ Other siblings may continue to attend school until or unless the child or anyone else in the household develops COVID symptoms and/or tests positive.	

my child's sibling at another school has been sent home to self-isolate due to being a contact of a confirmed positive case in their school	 → The sibling must self-isolate for 10 days → Child(ren) at this school can continue to attend until or unless the child or anyone else in the household develops COVID symptoms and/or tests positive. 	child(ren) can continue to attend school provided they don't have symptoms and/or have tested positive.		
Please note, at the moment $(1/4/21)$ international travel is not permitted and anyone returning from abroad has to isolate for 10 days either at a quarantine facility or at home. Always check the latest government guidance for travel for up to date information				
my child has travelled abroad from a country or territory that is NOT one of the exempt list of countries. (i.e. they need to self-isolate after returning from this country).	 → Follow the most up to date government guidance here. → Ring school to inform them you have returned to the UK and agree a return date to school. 	Either the quarantine period of 10 days has been completed. Or They have completed the Test To Release scheme with negative test results		
I have travelled from a country that requires us to quarantine (but my child didn't travel).	 → As long as you do not have/ have not had symptoms in the last 10 days, your child can continue to attend school. → The person who has travelled MUST NOT leave the house, including to do pick-ups and drop offs unless they have a negative result from a Test and release procedure. 	child(ren) can continue to attend school.
