

Mowbray School - Impact report for pupil premium 2016 to 2017

During the academic year 2016/17 seventy seven (77) of our pupils were in receipt of the pupil premium, this equated to 36.8% of our school population, the purpose of this premium is improve pupil's learning and help them access other educational opportunities. This report details the impact of the pupil premium.

The main areas for which we allocate the pupil premium are;

Work of a parent liaison officers supporting families.

Intervention support programs.

Enhanced opportunities- such as residential visits and non-residential visits.

The following progression data shows the progress of our pupils eligible for the pupil premium, compared with our pupils who are not eligible for the pupil premium. These progression levels are reported against the expectation that pupils in Key stages 1 & 2 make 2 levels of progress and in Key Stage 3 & 4, make 3 levels of progress. From the data below the progress pupils in receipt of pupil premium is higher than that of all other pupils.

Work of parent liaison officer supporting families.

The school maintains an intervention spreadsheet which details the pupils who have received additional specific intervention support and how this has helped pupils to progress.

Primary department

16 pupils in receipt of the pupil premium received additional specific intervention support, ranging from additional speech & language therapy support to relaxation therapy.

Secondary department

32 pupils in receipt of the pupil premium received additional specific intervention support, ranging from additional speech & language therapy support to additional support in Mathematics tuition.
